American mezzo-soprano Anna Grace Roth is based in Germany, and is currently pursuing her Master's degree in opera at the HfM Franz Liszt Weimar under the instruction of Professor Anne Schwanewilms. Her recent performances include Opera Galas throughout Thuringia, various concerts affiliated with the HfM in Weimar, and operatic roles including Prinz Orlofsky from *Die Fledermaus* by Johann Strauss and **Die** Nachbarin from *Mavra* by Igor Stravinsky.

Anna has also sung the roles **Cherubino** in *Le nozze di Figaro*, **Prinz Orlofsky** in a separate production of *Die Fledermaus*, **La vechietta** and **La duchessa** in *La bella dormente nel bosco*, and **Olga Olsen** in *Street Scene*.
